Established in 1955, Mead Hall Episcopal School challenges students to pursue academic excellence, spiritual growth, and moral integrity. After merging with Aiken Preparatory School in 2012, Mead Hall now serves a diverse and talented student body in grades 3K -12 and provides:

- a rigorous curriculum which enables students to reach their academic potential
- a firm spiritual foundation to guide a lifetime of moral choices
- a safe, nurturing community in which students develop confidence in themselves as capable leaders
- opportunities for students to exercise responsibility for their learning and actions

Facilities

The Upper School is housed on the historic Aiken Preparatory campus in downtown Aiken and offers small class sizes, one-to-one student iPad technology, Apple TV/LCD projector in each classroom, fully-equipped science laboratory, and a new 1250 sq.ft. art studio.

Admissions
