Tennis & Gym Rededication



Wednesday evening we had a good crowd brave the afternoon rain to gather for the rededications of the Aiken Prep Tennis Courts & Gymnasium and enjoy a reception given by our Panther Club. Prayers were offered by Father Joseph Whitehurst and there was a ribbon cutting for each. Emily Murphy joined us from the Chamber of Commerce for the ribbon cutting.

At 100 years old, the Aiken Prep Gymnasium needs our loving attention due its historic significance and its continued use for Mead Hall physical education and athletics. We marveled at the restoration of the floor and interior walls and we look forward to plans to paint the exterior this year. This restoration was made possible by the fundraising efforts of the Panther Club Golf Tournaments over the past two years. We recognized the 2020-2021 Golf Tournament organizers chaired by Tiffany Boyd and the 2021-2022 Golf Tournament organizers chaired by Karene Abrams and Keri Wilhelm. We also thanked Charlie Stanley for the significant donation of materials and labor for the work on west wall foundation and floor. We also thanked all who were involved in the work on the gym including our Facilities Manager, Jeff Brown who put his heart into overseeing the work. The ribbon was cut by Becky Marks, the Panther Club President.

The project began with the a treatment of polyurethane on the walls that sealed in the history of the gym where for decades balls were bounced off the walls by Aiken Prep students. There was then substantial foundation work that had to be completed before the floor could be refurbished. Stones Floor Finishing sanded the floor, replaced some floorboards, and brought the originally hickory back to a beautiful shine. Finally, the lines were painted, including lines for archery, which uses the gym throughout the winter season.

We thanked The Kevin and Brittany Kisner Foundation for the grant that made the renovation of the tennis court possible. With this generous grant for youth sports, the court was resurfaced with the traditional grass and clay colors, a new net was purchased and installed, two foursquare courts added because the students love to play foursquare at recess, and a commemorative bench installed. Brittany Kisner cut the ribbon and she was joined by foundation board members Leanna Wanta, Frank Townsend, and Jason Rabun. The tennis court has been transformed and now students enjoy playing tennis during recess, aftercare, and PE.

After Dr. Sawyer provided the story of the work and thanked all involved, we also heard from Becky Marks on behalf of the Panther Club, Brittany Kisner on behalf of the Kisner Foundation, and Student Council Secretary Jack Thomas Hamrick on behalf of the students.
