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## FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL



On the opening day of our faculty in-service this year, we welcomed the President of Aiken Technical College, Dr. Forest Mahan, to Mead Hall to offer a keynote address to our teachers. Dr. Mahan shared with us about his own experience attending a small private school in South Carolina and how well this education prepared him for college and beyond. He also spoke about the education we offer our students from the perspectives of a technical college president and the preparation of students for careers. Dr. Mahan noted that the critical thinking, collaboration, communication, and creativity that is built into our PS-12 curriculum and teaching will profoundly benefit our students ability to thrive in the changing world of 21st Century careers and life.

It is a rapidly changing world, so we have been adapting our curriculum over the past few years to prepare our students for the challenges and opportunities ahead of them, while ensuring that they continue to have solid educational foundations and knowledge. The math program in lower school ensures that our students possess an understanding of the relationship between numbers that enables students to better grasp higher mathematics and the way that math is used practically in the world. Our FOSS Science Program for grades K-8 provides lab-based and STEM curriculum that better engages students with the processes and the comprehension of science. Our new robotics program in middle school introduces the Sphero BOLT, which gives our students the opportunity to explore their creativity and learn critical thinking skills through three pathways to program the robots (draw, blocks, and Java text coding). This year we have added World Geography to sophomore year, to support our students in understanding the complex and globally connected world in which they are living. As well, in a world where Artificial Intelligence is rapidly changing the face of homework and assignments, our teachers are changing the way assignments are completed to ensure that they are the students' own work and AI is not doing the work for them, preventing them from learning.

I am grateful for the innovation and dedication of our faculty in implementing these new programs and striving to educate our students for life in the 21st Century. It was inspiring for them to have their efforts confirmed by Dr. Mahan in his keynote address. Our teachers are ever everything to the delivery of the education of our students and I thank them for their commitment!


Like Mead Hall, SRP is Committed to Community and Making a Difference.



## **2023-2024 COVID 19 SCHOOL PLAN**

#### Students and staff who test positive for COVID-19

- Students/staff who have a positive COVID-19 test result should isolate themselves from others for 5 days following the start of symptoms.
- Individuals should continue to isolate themselves from others until fever-free and symptoms have significantly improved.
- Students must be fever (temp 100.4) free for at least 24 hours (without fever reducing medication) before returning to school.
- Students are no longer required to be "cleared" to return to school. No COVID-19 re-test or MD clearance is required to return following illness.
- Parents are requested to notify the school office when a student will not be reporting to school.

#### Students, faculty and staff who are exposed to a COVID-19 positive individual:

- Persons identified as exposed to a COVID-19 positive individual may continue to attend school work if they have no symptoms.
- Contact tracing and notification of an exposure is no longer required.
- It is recommended that those who have direct exposure and develop symptoms of COVID-19 be tested.

Mead Hall will report respiratory illness outbreak to SC DHEC. Per DHEC a respiratory illness outbreak is 20% or more of students/staff within a shared setting of more than 5 individuals due to a respiratory illness within a 72 hour period.
