This week in our PK/K, Lower School, and Middle/Upper School chapels, the students all heard the story of God showing Moses the Promised Land from the mountaintop at the end of the long journey of the Israelites through the desert wilderness, and at the end of Moses' long life. Moses had dedicated his life to following God's call to bring the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and leading them to the Promised Land.

I highlighted to the students that every task we take on, big or small, demands our best efforts to see things through to a successful end. Moses himself had challenging days and he made mistakes, but he kept the faith and did not give up in his assignment. Whether it is a page of math, a reading, a piece of writing, each assignment our students are given is an opportunity for learning and growth and we only get out what we put in to each task we are given or take on. Around our students are those who have both expectations for them as well as encouragement for them, their teachers, parents, families, friends, etc. I reminded the students that they are never alone in giving their efforts since they always have the abiding presence and love of God to guide and support them.

This week I was particularly impressed with our PS (3K) class. They are our youngest students and they didn't even hear this message since weekly chapel begins in the PK year. The PS class designed their pumpkins in class. Mrs. Serago and Mrs. Defever provided the students with the materials but each child chose the design and carefully crafted their pumpkins into amazing jack-o'-lanterns over a whole week, and today these all sit proudly on the Pumpkin Wall. With commitment and effort like this, these PS students have a bright future, and are an example to us all!


