# FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL



## **SAIS ACCREDITATION VISIT NEXT WEEK**

Last week ended with a lot of fun for our students, with our Pumpkin Wall, PS-5 fall parties, a Halloween dance for 5th-8th grades, a lock-in for upper school, and finally our Fall Festival. I want to thank all of our teachers, staff, and parents who contributed to the success of all of these events. Our PTO created a wonderful Fall Festival and it was a great day to celebrate the new playground and thank the donors who made this dream a reality.

Next week we will have our Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS) Accreditation Visit, which I last wrote about in the September 8th issue of In the Loop. Every five years we are re-accredited by SAIS, the leading independent school association in the Southeast. We will also earn a dual accreditation with Cognia, which accredits public and private schools throughout the nation. The accreditation visit is the culmination of this process that we have been engaged in over the past year. We will welcome a five member accreditation team from SAIS member schools, listed below, who will visit from November 7th-9th and review Mead Hall for re-accreditation.

Our responses and evidence for the meeting of the standards of SAIS were submitted last spring and reviewed by the chair of the accreditation team during the pre-visit in May. This fall we completed our self-improvement plan for the next five years with the submission of our Self-Study Report. During the Accreditation Visit, the Accreditation Team will review our school through stakeholder meetings and classroom visits. The stakeholders with whom the team will meet include trustees, administration, faculty, students, parents, and alumni. Two weeks after the visit, the team will provide us with a report addressing the standards and the self-study report. I am looking forward to the feedback in this report because it will help inform us and help us to thoughtfully make improvements to our school over the next five years.

Our self-study consists of five key goals selected from among the twelve goals of the Strategic Plan that we developed last year and was introduced to the school community by the Strategic Planning Chair, Dr. Lynn Caravello, in the January 26th issue of In the Loop.The Strategic Plan is printed below and it will be featured in the Annual Report that you will receive in a few weeks.

Successful entries will answer the question and refer specifically to personal experiences and observations.

School entries should be submitted to the teacher, who will then forward them to the District Office or the Main Office of the school if private. If a home-schooled student, entries should be delivered to the Student Life Office at the University of South Carolina Aiken.


SCISA State Meets are Monday February 5 (Team) & Monday, February 12 (Individual) both in Sumter, SC.
