

am thankful to God each day for the opportunities our students have to learn and grow at Mead Hall. As the parent of a graduate of the Class of 2023, I am grateful for the preparation our graduates have for the opportunities and challenges of their college education. It is exciting to see our Mead Hall graduates out in the world and around the country succeeding in their chosen professions. At every level of education at Mead Hall, students are being provided the educational, moral, and spiritual foundations for life. This would not be possible without the dedicated and dynamic teaching of our faculty. Amidst nationwide challenges to schools and teachers following the pandemic that have caused the highest ever attrition rates of teachers, our faculty has worked tirelessly to educate our students beyond SC state standards and support them emotionally and spiritually.

I am happy to share with you our 2022-2023 Annual Report. It was an exciting year for us with several firsts. We had our largest ever enrollment of 390 students. We graduated our largest ever senior class of 18 students. We had our first ever graduates sign to college athletics, three in fact! Through the generosity of our community, we transformed the playground on the St. Thaddeus Campus.

We also kept up our pace of facilities improvements, restoring and painting the exterior of the Aiken Prep Campus Gymnasium, painting the front and the sides of Harrington Hall, and we replaced floors, painted, and made improvements on both campuses.

The 2022-2023 school year was also a time of preparation for our reaccreditation by the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS). SAIS is the premier accrediting body for independent schools in the Southeast. SAIS sets rigorous standards of institutional excellence for its schools that must be met for accreditation. By meeting the high standards of our SAIS accreditation, we will also have a dual accreditation with Cognia (formerly

the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in the Southeast), which provides us with a nationally recognized accreditation for both public and private schools. In the spring of 2023, the SAIS Accreditation Team Chair affirmed that we have met the Standards and Indicators set by SAIS. The second part of the accreditation process was the submission of the Self-Study this fall that was reviewed by the Accreditation Team during their visit to Mead Hall in early November. This Self-Study is drawn from the Five Year Strategic Plan that we drafted last year through a consultative process. Soon we will receive the Accreditation Report from the team that

will provide us with guidance as we seek to improve our school over the next five years, guided by our strategic plan. Please read the Strategic Plan, 2023-2028, in this Annual Report.

Our Annual Fund rose to over \$216,000 in donations with the participation of 25% of our school families. We hope to increase participation this year since the Annual Fund is essential to increasing the compensation of our teachers, enriching the academic program, and improving facilities each year. Central to our mission as a ministry of St. Thaddeus Church is to provide an affordable education of excellence with a Christian foundation. Therefore, we depend upon the Annual Fund to help us meet an operating budget that goes beyond tuition income to provide what we want our students to have in a Mead Hall education. I appeal to you to support the Annual Fund at any level of support, from a Family level gift up to a Pillars Society gift. Every contribution helps our students and our school.

I would like to especially thank our parent and family volunteers who make such an impact each year. Our PTO and Panther Club do so much to support our students and our athletes in so many ways as well as raising funds to support our programs and our facilities. Whether it is volunteering at Strawberry Festival, managing the gate and concessions at home games, or working at the Book Fair, our parent and family volunteers make a difference to our students.

Enjoy seeing the life of our students at Mead Hall in these pages and thank you for your support of Mead Hall.



The Class of 2023 has departed Mead Hall in all directions to attend colleges near and far. 

## THE AMAZING LIFE OF OUR STUDENTS

Our students are blessed with a rich and dynamic school life at Mead Hall. Within the classroom and beyond the walls of the school, students are enriched in their learning and growth at Mead Hall. Educational and extracurricular experiences include hands-on learning, school trips, the fine arts, athletics, participation in clubs, service to the community, and memorable events. Through the school life of Mead Hall, our students build character as well as skills in leadership, service, sportsmanship, collaboration, friendship, responsibility, resilience, and goal accomplishment.

















#### SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY AND THE WORLD

Every year our students participate in community service, which is a reflection of our Christian and community values. Lower School has a number of class service projects as well as all-campus projects including the "It's spooky to be hungry" food drive and Pinwheels for Peace. The middle and upper school students participate in several projects mainly through our service clubs. Last year these efforts included Beta Club's food drives for the St. Thaddeus Soup Kitchen through the Peanut Butter and Jelly Drive in the fall and the Reverse Advent Calendar Bags in December, the cleaning of trash from Barnwell for the Adopt-a-Highway program of Keep Aiken County Beautiful, Interact Club's work for the Night of 1000 Lights and fundraisers for charities, the Environmental Club's recycling program, and a dress down to raise money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. All upper school students must complete a minimum of 20 service hours each year and middle school students are invited to participate in service hours. In 2022-2023 we joined the President's Service Award Program and we had middle and upper school students recognized at the Bronze and Gold levels, accomplishments that make a difference in the world.

#### FINE ARTS

#### **ART**

For the school year of 2022-2023, Lower School art students focused on expanding their understanding of the elements of art into specialized themes for each grade. Routines were reinforced and there was an overarching goal to build community and family between the students through creative thinking and the making of art. Again, this was done with a cross-curricular approach that weaves in other subjects such as math, science, social studies, and the English language arts. This was done with the hopes that their creativity can be a tool that will help them be successful in all areas of their life, no matter where their lives take them. At the beginning of the year, all grades started off with learning how to draw self-portraits. This was the first year that kindergarten students were given the opportunity to take art with Ms. Cooke, so these students started with a blank slate. Their specialized focus was on color and later in the year, line and pattern. The students' learning and appreciation only grows through the years of lower school art.

The Studio Art classes on the Aiken Prep Campus are always busy and creating new forms of art. No year has the same projects and this always gives the student an element of surprise. The beginning of the school year is always started with drawing skills by using the pencil to interpret textural and contrasting elements in any image non-objective or objective. This opens the door when adding the use of color through exploring with paint, papers, pencils and various other mediums. Students create Paintings, Sculptures, Two Dimensional Studies and Illustrations.

At the end of the year with the accumulation of a large body of work students are encouraged to enter their art in our yearly Gallery Art Show. This is important to every artist as the exhibition of their art is also an enlightening experience. Mrs. Nowlin believes the art comes to life when it's in a gallery show and this gives any student a feeling of pride and improves confidence.









#### DRAMA

The Dramatic & Theatrical Arts in Middle School had a successful and busy year! Students in grades 5th through 8th studied and performed works inspired by literary folklore, and performed six productions including our very well-received collaborative Christmas Show. Our public speaking component became more robust this year, and drama teacher Mrs. Ferguson worked closely with the ELA department to assist the students in preparing exemplary performances for Declamation. Our 7th and 8th grade combined class additionally prepared a competition piece for SCISA's Drama Competition, and they and the rest of our drama students attended the competition in November at the Newberry Opera House. We also attended a Youth Wing performance of The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe at the Aiken Community Playhouse and a performance by folk music artists at the USC-Aiken Etherredge Center.

#### **MUSIC**

Our Lower School music classes are where students learn the foundations of instrumental and vocal music each week. The joy of singing is expressed every Wednesday in our chapel services and in 2022-2023 our music teacher, Mrs. Matson, added a choir that wonderfully led and performed at the 1st-4th grade chapel. The other musical highlights of the school year on the St. Thaddeus Campus were the Christmas and spring performances by the students.

Under the direction of our new band director, Dr. Joseph Johnson, our middle and upper band students presented a Christmas Concert that featured the Beginning Band, High School Chamber Ensemble, and the Concert Band (7th/8th and HS students). The program included traditional and contemporary Christmas Carols. In March, the Concert and Beginning Bands presented their Spring Concert with several challenging works to an audience of well over 100. Deserving students were also presented awards sponsored by "The Instrumentalist", which is a scholarly journal highlighting research and teaching involving band and orchestra.



Mead Hall Episcopal School offers a full, interscholastic experience through its athletic program. Mead Hall is a member of South Carolina Independent Schools Association (SCISA) which governs our participation in varsity / junior varsity Interscholastic contests. Mead Hall is also a member of Augusta Aiken Middle School League (AAMSL), which governs our middle school interscholastic contests. Athletic activities that allow opportunities for middle and upper school students include: bowling, girls volleyball, tennis, swimming, cross country, golf, basketball, soccer, track and field, and girls softball. Sports/activities such as archery and cheer allow participation to include lower school grades also. This year our softball team began competing and in 2023-2024 our middle and upper school cheer squads will return. Almost 85% of the middle and upper school population participate in the athletic program. Additionally, more than half of the students participate in multiple sports.

The 2022 - 2023 PTO board would like to extend our sincerest gratitude for your support in making this year our best yet. ## **FINANCIAL REPORT 2022-2023**

Offering an excellent and affordable education to our families is central to our mission, so our tuition is priced much lower than other independent schools in the CSRA. Therefore, we cannot fund Mead Hall's budget on tuition alone. We require additional funds to retain and recruit excellent teachers through compensation and benefits, enrich the educational experience of our students, and improve our facilities and technology. We bridge this budget gap with the Annual Fund and other income. This gap amounts to \$740 for each student at Mead Hall.


The 2022-2023 Fiscal Report has a good story to tell. Due to the increased impact of Annual Fund income in funding the enrichment of the educational program and facilities improvements, our expenses on wages and salaries has dropped to 75%, whereas it has previously been about 80% per year, and that is with a 6% raise in compensation in 2022-2023 for our dedicated faculty and staff. The 7% spent on program expenses is greater than in previous years, highlighting both the increased cost of food, but also the impact that a stronger Annual Fund is having on the investment we are making in the educational experience of our students.

On the income side, the 8.7% in fundraising income increased from the 6% that was attributed to fundraising income in the 2021-2022 school year, and 95% of unrestricted fundraising income in 2022-2023 was from Annual Fund. For two programs that show income - extended day, and learning strategies, this income is reduced from this number by expenses, although summer camp does make a difference each year in contributing to our budget. Although not reflected directly in the charts, the contributions of PTO and Panther Club are also important to funding school needs each year beyond our budget.

In order to uphold our mission and keep our school accessible to our families, the Annual Fund is essential to closing the budgetary gap between tuition income and the actual cost of educating each student. Tuition has traditionally covered approximately 90% of a Mead Hall education, with Annual Fund and income from extracurriculars, summer camps and the school store as the other main sources of funding for our school. However, we have successfully reduced the dependance on tuition over the past couple of years to approximately 84% through increased giving to the Annual Fund, which has gone from only \$43,000 in 2019-2020 to \$216,000 in 2022-2023, thanks to the generous financial support of parents, grandparents, faculty, staff, trustees, alumni, church members, and friends. Annual Fund donations have allowed us to keep tuition low while prioritizing the retention and recruitment of excellent teachers, enriching the academic program, and making facilities and technology improvements.

Outside of our annual revenue and operating expenses, we received restricted gifts from three important sources in 2022-2023: PTO, Panther Club, and the St. Thaddeus Playground Major Gifts Initiative. The PTO and the Panther Club have a major impact on our programs and facilities. The St. Thaddeus Playground Major Gifts Initiative has provided the transformation of the large playground at St. Thaddeus Campus for our current and future students. In the next few years we will need to have a full capital campaign to raise funds for major improvements to our facilities and to build an endowment to strengthen our school for the future.



The playground features an astroturf soccer field, a basketball court, a

foursquare court, and a tricycle track. This fall the work was completed with the addition of a large deck under the oak tree and a tricycle shed. We would like to thank the STC Playground Major Gifts Committee - Hillary Bolen, Brittany Kisner, Kathy Reynolds, and Kelly Reynolds, who worked with Dr. Sawyer to seek donations from our families to make this dream a reality.



Our Panther Club has made a huge impact on our athletics facilities over the past few years through the golf tournaments and annual fundraising. The past few years the Panther Club has invested in our Aiken Prep Gymnasium. The Panther Club has been pivotal in funding the new weight room, the repair of the foundation and the restoration of the floor, and this past summer the repair and painting of the exterior of this historic building. ## REMEMBRANCES FROM OUR LEGACY SCHOOLS

## The Aiken Preparatory School - Established 1916

The sport of bicycle polo, for all we know, may have first been tested on the playing field of Eton. But for several generations of APS boys, this exciting and informal game was invented over 60 years ago on a hard, sloping patch of clay, stretching between the school house and the present day tennis court. The precise year doesn't matter. Neither did the rules, at least at the beginning.

Trial and error ultimately dictated that bicycle polo should be played by regular polo rules with two teams of four players to a team. "Riding off", as with horses, was considered part of the game, but despite the mandatory use of helmets, and the optional use of shin and knee guards, falls, resulting in minor injuries often outnumbered goals by a hefty margin.



Two vivid observations of bike polo will always remain: 1) on game days, regardless of which team won, the chief beneficiaries were always the attending medic and a local bicycle repair man with a bag of spare spokes; and 2) no matter what the heights of stardom attained by any biking, budding Tommy Hitchcocks, these fun games on Aiken's red clay were of use only as happy memories once the boys moved on to Northern prep schools.

## The Aiken Day School - Established 1933

So much is known about Mr. Harrington's connection with APS, but most people don't know about his involvement with Aiken Day School. It all started quite innocently. Mr. Fletcher was on the board of Aiken Day School. He had just attended a meeting in 1961 and found out the French teacher was leaving. He kindly volunteered Mr. Harrington as a new French teacher at Aiken Day School. If that wasn't bad enough, the next year, the head of Aiken Day School resigned, and they needed another. Mr. Fletcher again volunteered Mr. Harrington. You might say to yourself how could he be on both campuses. At that point, Mr. Harrington was actually like the Asst. Headmaster at APS, so there was a little flexibility in the schedule. That is the only way he could have managed both jobs. He was Head of Aiken Day School from 1962 to 1973.



Mr. Harrington became the APS Headmaster in 1971 so for two years he was the head of both schools. He had finally had enough of the "double duty" and left the Aiken day of school after the 1972–73 school year.



## Mead Hall Episcopal School - Established 1955

Mead Hall briefly had a high school in the late 1950s. The social life included dances with a May Queen, which in 1958 was Anna Estelle Giaffis. The students of the high school had several responsibilities, including the staffing of the annual, The Pillars, the Safety Patrol, and a student newspaper called The Echo. In the 1958 annual, Miss Giaffis reports on the work of this newspaper:

The staff of "The Echo" for 1957-58 has its goal to publish a bigger and better newspaper. The paper is written by the students for the students. So, our aim is to cover all school events and publish features of interest to the students. We are very privileged to have as our faculty advisor Mrs. George McMillan, without whose assistance we would not have been able to publish the kind of paper worthy of Mead Hall.


