BLACK HISTORY MONTH ON THE AIKEN PREP CAMPUS

The month of February at the Middle and Upper school on the Aiken Prep Campus was chock-full of activities and events that celebrated Black History Month, the first of which was sent to all staff and faculty. Dr. Pontoo delighted our faculty with a collection of **Heart Healthy Recipes**, the **NASA Modern Figures Toolkit** and events to attend virtually, locally and in Atlanta. The toolkit provided a host of resources and educational activities for teachers to use with their students in grades K-12.

The Diversity Club, started by one of our seniors, Esther Marks, celebrated Black History by decorating bulletin boards honoring famous African Americans and inventors. Not only did the current president, Zalyric Singleton provide much of the information that was shared on the morning slides, but she was also in charge of a chapel service in which she delivered an encouraging message to her fellow peers on being nice to others. On another day, the secretary of the Diversity Club, Destini Trowell educated students about her involvement in the NAACP Youth Council, which is "composed of hundreds of state and county-wide operations in which youth (usually teens) volunteer to share their voices or opinions with their fellow council members, and then strive to address the issues raised on a local or national level."

Mead Hall students were also educated about the significance of soul food to the African American community. In conjunction with the school menu, a brief summary and recipes were provided on the table tops in the cafeteria throughout the month including the following food items: corn bread, field peas, macaroni and cheese, Bar-B-Q and butter beans. Several students from the sophomore class took it a step further and enjoyed a soul food lunch which was provided by one of Aiken's finest soul food restaurants, Unique Catering located at 1624 Hampton Avenue NW. Some of the popular foods enjoyed by students included salmon patties, fried fish, Bar-B-Q ribs, cabbage, corn bread, macaroni and cheese and homemade peach cobbler.

Of course our very own Mr. Hawthorne played a role in this month's festivities as well. Introduced by Gabby Davis, last Wednesday, students were exposed to Mr. Hawthorne's powerful message "It Doesn't Matter What You Look Like" that not only kept students focused but also inspired them to think differently about the words PASSION, PURPOSE and CALLING.

As Mead Hall does every year this time, students attended the Black History Program performed by the students at **Second Baptist Christian Prep School**. It was very exciting to see elementary aged students deliver a memorized speech about influential African Americans. Held at the church's new location, 1151 York Ave, NE, senior Pastor Raymonda R. Speller was in attendance along with friends and families and Mead Hall students were welcomed by Principal, Tabitha Daniels. Also in attendance and featured in one of the student presentations was Aiken City Council woman, Ms. Gail Diggs.

Winding down the month was a student diversity conference held at Ashley Hall in Charleston, SC. "The Belonging Summit" was attended by several independent school students in South Carolina who came together to learn about belonging, inclusion and diversity. Although this was Mead Hall's first time attending, students were engaged, well fed and as one student remarked "I met a lot of new friends!" This conference will no doubt be an annual event for students in 8th - 12th grade.

Finally, students were invited to partake in one more activity which was a field trip to Inspire Christian Worship, church home of Mr. Hawthorne. Located at 809 Shartom Drive, Augusta, service is held every sunday at 9:30 am.

But, if you missed any of what happened during the month of February and you'd like to still participate, there's still time! The Annual Augusta Black History Exhibition at the City Gallery, located at 535 Telfair St, in Downtown Augusta, GA will be on display until Thursday, March 7, 2024.
