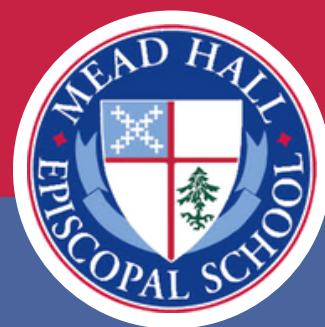

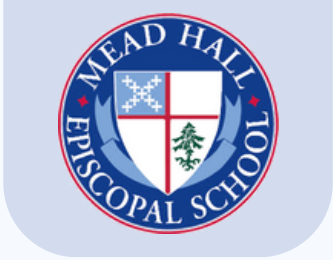


Our Facilities Manager, Jeff Brown, has this message to share with his appreciation for all of the help we have received this summer:

CELEBRATING ANNUAL FUND 2025-2026

Our tuition is significantly lower than other independent schools in the CSRA and beyond because it is vital to our mission to maintain a tuition that is affordable to our families. Since our low tuition does not cover the cost of educating our students with excellence, we depend upon the generosity of our families and friends through the Mead Hall Annual Fund.

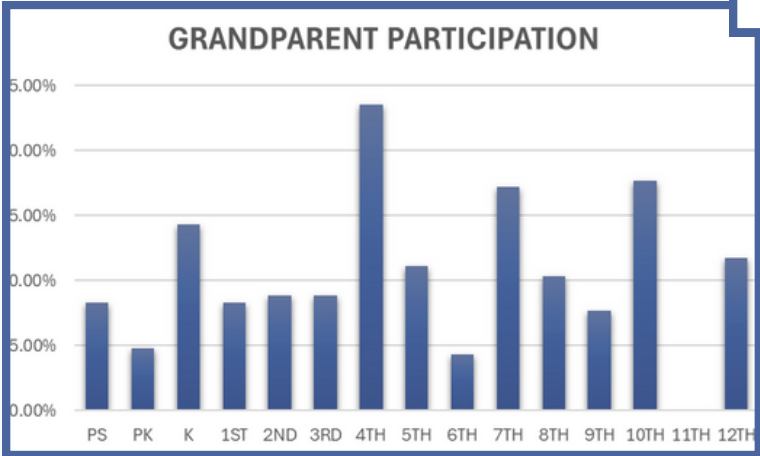
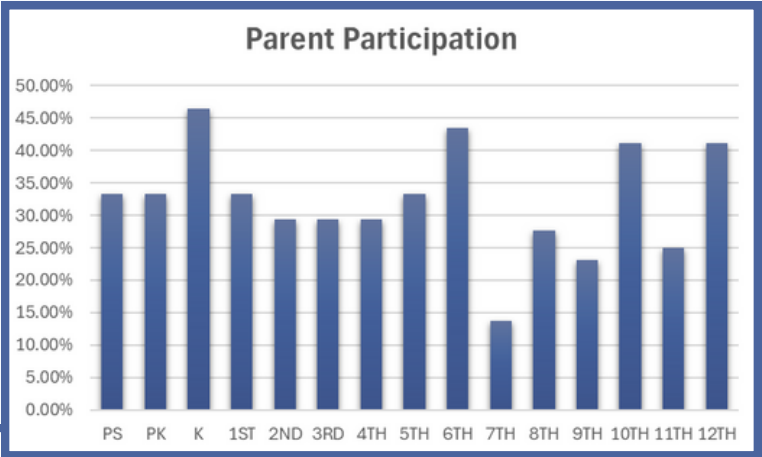
I am glad to report that we have raised **\$187,383.20** through the Annual Fund this past school year. While it is our goal to raise our Annual Fund beyond \$200,000, this is a significant contribution to our school that makes such a difference. We received Annual Fund gifts from parents, grandparents, family of our students, trustees, St. Thaddeus parishioners, alumni, faculty, and friends. We are so grateful for these donations and the impact they made during the 2024-2025 school year.

This past year we had **30%** of our school families contribute. While our hope is to raise the percentage of the participation from our parents, we are still higher than the 19% of parents that participated a few years ago in 2022-2023. We also began tracking our grandparent participation this year, and we are happy to report that we received gifts from many of our grandparents.

Every gift helps to BRIDGE THE GAP between tuition income and the actual cost of educating each student. Each donation to the Annual Fund supports the enrichment of every aspect of the educational experience of our students and the improvement of our facilities. The impact of facilities improvement this summer has been significant, much of it through the support of the Annual Fund.



FIRST DAYS OF SCHOOL

Thursday, July 31st

9:30 5th-8th grade families - (Regular Daily Uniform) Park on Pendleton Street and report to the sanctuary with your child for our start of school service. Students will leave from the church and walk with their teachers back to campus. (It is best to place all supplies and bookbags in lockers during Meet the Teacher for this reason.)

10:00 9th-12th grade families - (Regular Daily Uniform) Park on Pendleton Street and report to the sanctuary with your child for our start of school service. Students will leave from the church and walk with their teachers back to campus. (It is best to place all supplies and bookbags in lockers during Meet the Teacher for this reason.) For students that drive, please gather in the APC student parking lot by 9:45 to walk over to the church with a teacher.

Carline Procedures

Morning Carline (8:15 - 8:25)

- Parents should drive east on Barnwell Avenue—in front of the main building—and turn right on Florence Street. Turn right into the campus and drop off students behind the cafeteria. Circle around and return to Florence Street heading south toward Richland Avenue.
- Please stay to the right while waiting on Barnwell and Florence, and do not block the faculty parking lot or front entrance drives.
- For your child's safety, do not let children out on Barnwell Avenue or in the faculty parking lot. Carline will proceed most efficiently when all follow these guidelines.
- Students must report to their first period class by 8:25 am; students arriving after 8:30 am will be sent to the office to be marked tardy.



Afternoon Carline (3:30 - 3:45)

- Parents should line up along Florence Street and Barnwell Avenue, parallel to the brick walls. Please pull all the way up to the sign that says “Afternoon Carline Begins Here”.
- Parents should not enter any parking lot of the school, including the student lot at Florence and Richland.
- Parents should not allow younger children to play in the courtyard area while waiting on dismissal. Two classes are being taught on the lower level, and the noise level is disruptive. Also, there are no school supervisors on duty prior to dismissal. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!
- Students will wait for afternoon pick up in the grassy area behind the cafeteria. Under the supervision of faculty on duty, students will be permitted to walk along the brick wall on Florence Street and enter their cars, after which parents may carefully pull out and depart. For your child’s safety, students will not be allowed to climb over the brick walls or load your vehicle on Barnwell Avenue.
- At 3:45 any remaining students will go to Extended Care. After 3:45 students on the Aiken Prep campus must be in Extended Care, athletic practice, or other supervised activity. Athletes will be instructed by their coaches when and where to report to practice.

Cell Phone Procedures

Electronic Communication Devices (ECD) - These items include, but are not limited to, cell phones, smart watches, electronic games, radios, cameras or MP3 players.

Upon entering the school, students in grades 5-8 MUST turn in their ECD to the appropriate grade-level storage locker. The slots will be labeled with student names by grade-level. The fifth grade storage locker will be kept in the 5th grade classroom and remain locked throughout the day. The storage locker for 6th-8th grade students will be located in the main office and remain locked throughout the day. Any students that will be dismissed early from school will be able to pick up their ECD while signing out in the main office. Any students in grades 5-8 who do not have an ECD will need written documentation from a parent or guardian to indicate that they do not have an ECD. Any attempt to intentionally circumvent this process will be considered a major discipline infraction.

Students in grades 9-12 may have ECDs with them, but they should not be seen, heard, or used in class or hallway without special approval of the teacher. Upper School students MUST turn in their cell phone to the cell phone “tree” in each classroom. Upper School students may not use or share cell phones with Middle School students during the day.

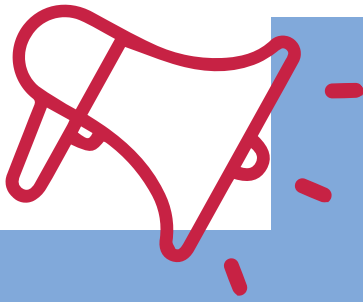
School Supply Lists and Packs

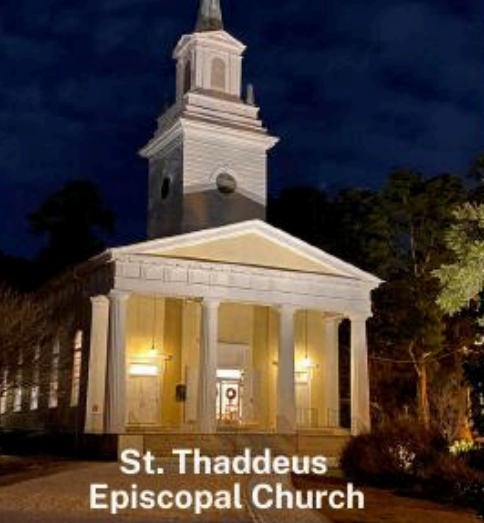

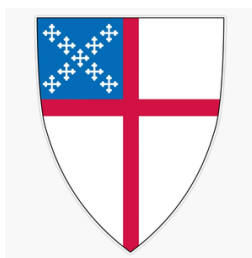
