A MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

It is with great sadness that we read the news of the shooting on Wednesday at Annunciation Church and Catholic School in Minneapolis. Let us keep the two children who died, those who were injured, and all who have been traumatized, as well as the families of the children, in our hearts and in our prayers.

This is a terrible reminder that we are called to do the utmost to protect our children and ensure their physical safety and emotional wellbeing. Safety has been top of mind for us at Mead Hall over the past few years and we have implemented policy changes and improvements to our two campuses to better secure our school and protect our students and staff. Changes over the past few years have included: Locking the gates to the St. Thaddeus Campus and creating a new entrance door with a camera, and most recently adding new security doors with a more secure lock and fob system to our red brick classroom building (PS-2nd), and at the Aiken Prep Campus, locking doors and adding a maglock to the door used to access the classrooms at the lower rear of the building and installing a new camera system at the main door.

Last December, we had a security assessment completed by the Holdfast Security Group, led by retired FBI agent Rob Chadwick, the former head of the Tactical Training Unit at Quantico. We have been implementing his recommendations and making plans for physical changes to our buildings, which are an important focus of our Ignite Campaign. The initial security impact of the Ignite Campaign will be the installation of new security doors for the St. Thaddeus Campus school office and the main entrance to the Stevenson-McClelland Building (cafeteria, gym, 3rd & 4th) which will be completed soon. A vital recommendation from this report was to train our faculty and staff in responding to an active shooter or similar crisis so we led our faculty and staff in a training on this during our professional development afternoon in March, and this training is ongoing. We will revisit this training next at our September faculty meetings which will be followed by our intruder drills.

Tragedies like those at Annunciation raise our level of concern and anxiety. I hope and pray that we will not be gripped by fear but take action together to safeguard the lives and wellbeing of our children and all those we love. I encourage you to reach out to me with your concerns and I also look forward to sharing more of our future and developing plans for the safety of our students at Mead Hall.
