Dear Families,

Our hearts are heavy as we remember the recent tragedy at Annunciation Catholic Church School, where innocent lives were lost in a senseless act of violence. We extend our deepest sympathy to the families and community who are grieving. This heartbreaking event reminds us all that no school is immune, and that the safety of our children must remain our highest priority. Recently, Governor McMaster signed a law that provides a School Resource Officer in every public school across South Carolina. While this is an important step forward, independent an alternative schools like ours were not included. This is not fair. Our families pay the same property taxes as everyone else, yet not a single dollar comes back to support the safety of our children. If the more than 58,000 students in independent and alternative schools suddenly entered the public system, it would collapse under the weight. And yet, when parents make the choice for independent education, their children are left less protected. We cannot accept this any longer. Outdated laws written generations ago, many with discriminatory intent, still block funding for independent schools. But in 2025, those relics of the past should not determine whether a child is safe at school.

That is why we are asking you to stand with us in this fight. Please take a moment to sign the petition linked below and share it with friends, family, and neighbors. This petition is the first step in demanding that all children in South Carolina, no matter where they go to school, have equal access to protection.

Your voice matters. Your signature matters. Together, we can send a strong and unified message: our children's safety must come first.



Homecoming Week and Dance



College Guidance Has Been Busy!

Dr. Pontoo pounced on USC's campus along with college counselors from around the state to hear from College of Charleston, Clemson and University of South Carolina admissions offices. Over breakfast, she heard updates from each school and wrote a ton of notes. For example, the University of South Carolina's Darla Moore School of Business holds the No. 1 National Ranking for its undergraduate International Business program, students can earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology from the College of Charleston and a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing from MUSC in only four and a half years and out of 61,517 applications received, 23,586 students were admitted to Clemson last year!

While on USC's campus, Dr. Pontoo ran into fellow alumna Maria Reyes, who is currently a junior. Although admitted to several schools (including Loyola University Chicago, Catholic University, Lake Forest College, Rollins College and American University to name a few), she decided to stay close to home...Go Gamecocks!

The very next day, Mead Hall's College of Charleston representative, Diamond Young, met with all of the upper school students to share knowledge about the college admissions process for College of Charleston and unique opportunities that students can take advantage of.

Finally, Dr. Pontoo attended the annual Guidance Workshop in Orangeburg, SC hosted by the South Carolina Independent School Association. 




Congratulations to our B-Team players for a streak of wins the past week.
